



Workshop Outline

WASH in Emergency

LENGTH: 2 days

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

This workshop is designed for the emergency situation in aftermath of the mega-earthquakes in Nepal. With the emergency situation and huge number of people living in the temporary shelters, there is high risk of water, sanitation and hygiene related diseases in the earthquake affected areas. To prevent such epidemics in the related areas, high level of precaution should be taken. This workshop helps volunteer to upgrade knowledge on water, sanitation and hygiene and builds capacity to make people aware on the importance of water, sanitation and hygiene and related behaviors hence preventing the diseases in the temporary shelters and community.

OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the workshop participants will be able to:

- To upgrade technical knowledge and capacity building introducing concept of working with people in emergencies.
- To enhance the WASH knowledge among local staffs.
- To deliver the technical knowledge on latrine construction and siting.

PARTICIPANTS

The workshop is oriented towards participants who are:

- Volunteering on WASH activities in emergency situation
- Volunteers and local staffs working in water, sanitation and hygiene, community development, or health projects
- Motivated to prevent WASH related diseases in emergency situation
- Community and community health promoters/workers who inform and educate households on WASH and focus on WASH behavior in emergency situation

This is an introductory level workshop where participants will be able to gain knowledge and information on various techniques on water, sanitation and hygiene and also to communicate and respond a community in emergency situation. Participants will observe demonstrations and practice using various methods. However, this workshop is not intended to provide full training on the construction of each technology or implementation of projects on particular aspects.

METHODS OF INSTRUCTION

This participatory style workshop includes theory, classroom exercises, open discussion, demonstrations, and hands-on practice in the workshop. Active participant engagement in learning activities is highly encouraged.
