

Workshop Outline

E-WASH in Recovery Phase

LENGTH: 3 days

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

This workshop is designed considering the existing post emergencies situation of Nepal. We all are well experienced the emergencies in WASH sector aftermath of the mega earthquake (April 25, 2015). As the emergency period has been passed at this moment gradually service provider sectors including Government, INGO's, NGO's and CBO's are putting their steps back from the emergency response. However the WASH aspect remains vulnerable in many districts, which appear as the risk for WASH sector. This workshop will help participants to manage water, sanitation and hygiene in communities with practice based approach.

OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the workshop participants will be able to:

- Understand the importance of Water, Sanitation and Hygiene in recovery phase
- Discuss the impact of emergencies on WASH
- Make informed decision regarding their WASH practice and implementing WASH behavior in communities
- Acquire knowledge regarding diarrheal disease prevention, oral rehydration solution preparation and choosing appropriate household water treatment option
- Know more on sanitation, environmental sanitation and waste management

PARTICIPANTS

The workshop is oriented towards participants who are:

- Working in water and sanitation, community development, or health projects
- Motivated to work with households in developing countries to provide safe water
- Currently implementing community oriented WASH projects and motivated to expand, improve or strengthen their projects
- Community leaders and community health promoters/workers who inform and educate households on WASH and behavior change

Participants may be:

- Decision makers who are planning or considering WASH or post emergency projects
- Non-governmental organizations (NGO), international NGOs, government agencies, or individuals considering best way to deliver safe water, sanitation and hygiene to a community

This is an introductory level workshop. Participants will observe demonstrations and practice using various methods. However, this workshop is not intended to provide full training on the construction of each technology or implementation of projects on particular aspects. Participation by women is encouraged. Preferably, 2 to 5 people from each organization would attend to ensure that they learn together and optimum benefit from the workshop.

METHODS OF INSTRUCTION

This participatory style workshop includes theory, classroom exercises, open discussion, case studies, demonstrations, and hands-on practice. Active participant engagement in learning activities is encouraged.

CONTENT

The following is a list of the topics to be covered. A specific agenda will be developed for every workshop based on consultation with the organizer and the participant's needs.

- WASH in emergency recovery, its objectives and target
- Effect of WASH behaviors and disease transmission & blocking
- Diarrheal Diseases and ORS preparation
- Water Quality and Purification options
- Sanitation and hygiene in emergency recovery phase
- Environmental sanitation, total sanitation and waste management
- Use of IEC materials
- Delivering key WASH message
